

FREE STEAMPUNK LENORMAND CARD DECK

Carrie Paris kindly released her Lenormand Holiday Learning Deck into the public domain in 2013. I really liked the “Victorian ephemera” style, and had a notion that they would look good in a steampunk setting. My re-framing of the images has suit & rank designations on both sides, so these cards can additionally be used by both left and right-handed players to play games using a 36-card deck – for example, “Durak”.

This PDF is designed to be printed on A4 Portrait sized paper or card. It is recommended that you print out the Test Page (page 2) on its own as a first step – just to check that the scaling on your printer produces the correct size assets. Cut guidelines are provided for separating the cards using either a guillotine, rotary cutter, or hobby/exacto knife, ruler and cutting board.

The cards should come out at 63mm x 88mm, or “standard poker” which is the same size as (for example) Magic The Gathering or Pokemon - hence these cards will fit nicely into plastic sleeves designed for those games. Sleeving your cards will provide a robust and durable deck. When sleeving, you can either print on paper and slip a old standard poker sized card behind the paper to provide rigidity. Alternatively - for a small cost - you may wish to use any online print-on-demand service to get this PDF printed out on 300 gsm cardstock, which is approximately the weight of commercially produced playing cards.
